3. Explain the doctrine of Pre-established harmony.
4. State Leibnitz's theory of knowledge.

5. Discuss the philosophy of Leibnitz as a form of objective idealism.
6. Discuss Leibnitz's view of monads as windowless.
7. Explain the law of contradiction.

9. Elucidate the law of sufficient reason.
10. Explain the concept "Monad of monads".
11. State the arguments for the existence of God according to Leibnitz.
12. Distinguish between the concepts of desire and will in the philosophy of Leibnitz.
13. Discuss Leibnitz's solution to the problems of evil.
14. Can we regard Monadology as a form of pluralistic metaphysical idealism? Discuss.
15. Bring about the difference between apperception and appetition.
16. Give a brief account of the concept of consciousness in the Monodology of Leibnitz.
