- (b) Analyse the plot of Mulk Raj Anand's "The Lost Child". (400 words)

3. (a) Analyse Hardy's *The Mayor of Casterbridge* as a regional novel. (400 words) 20

**OR**

- (b) *The Mayor of Casterbridge* is a tragedy of circumstances. Discuss. (400 words)

4. (a) Comment on *A Tiger for Malgudi* as an allegory of human dignity. (400 words) 20

**OR**

- (b) Analyse the plot of Narayan's novel *A Tiger for Malgudi*. (400 words)

5. (a) What are the thoughts evoked in the essay 'Meditations in Westminster Abbey'? (400 words) 20

**OR**

- (b) Analyse the autobiographical element in the essay 'Old China'. (400 words)

6. (a) Comment on Nehru's 'Harrow and Cambridge' as a subtle mingling of character sketches and narrative. (400 words) 20

- (b) Outline the portraits of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert as drawn by Lytton Strachey in his *Queen Victoria*. (400 words)

7. (a) Describe the differences between Biography and Autobiography. (400 words) 20
